INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

- Scholarships provide funding for tertiary study
- The selection process is competitive and there are many specific scholarships available
 - Academic merit is always a major consideration, ideally you need Level 2 with Merit or Excellence. Some scholarships are for students experiencing financial hardship. Most are specific in their criteria.
- NCEA Level 4 scholarship examinations are a qualification. Rewards range from \$500 to \$10,000 depending on achievement.
- Start early if you wish to apply for a scholarship. Do not wait until the deadline

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE MONEYHUB DATABASE and CAREER CENTRAL

The best place to start is the MoneyHub database https://www.moneyhub.co.nz/scholarships-nz.html.

Log in and go to Resources and then click on the Money square and you can access information on Moneyhub and also Scholarship information.

Read through the Summary on this link and the How to Use this Guide, then scroll down to the Scholarship List – Fast Links. These include links to all the NZ universities and their general and faculty specific scholarships. You need to search further to find out your eligibility for these scholarships by clicking on the links provided. You need to ascertain the criteria for each scholarship.

Criteria for selection vary. Some factors which may apply are:

- Academic ability applies to all scholarships, related to Year 12 results
- Regional and national achievement sports/arts/technology, etc
- School decile (our school is Decile 1)
- Extra curricular activities are important
- Leadership ability

- Commitment to the community
- Course of study is often a criteria
- Ethnicity can be a criteria
- NZ Citizenship or Permanent residency can be a factor
- There may be rules around gaining a scholarship if taking a gap year

Scrolling down further you will find **Private Organisation Scholarships**, these do not include all the scholarships we know about, so we have provided you with some extras in this booklet

Following this section is **Regional Scholarships**, mostly you will only be looking at Auckland ones, but if you are studying away from Auckland, this may be worth a look though they are normally awarded to students in their region

The last section on Moneyhub is **Specific Scholarships**, this includes Maori, Pacific and a listing of overseas scholarships

Lastly read the **Tips for Scholarship Application**, this is helpful information for you to nail an impressive scholarship application.

Accommodation Scholarships

Many of the New Zealand universities have additional scholarships available for their Halls of Residence. This information can be accessed by searching on the scholarship pages of the university websites. Try using the word "accommodation" in your search. Also many first year scholarships which previously covered tuition fees can now be used towards accommodation fees instead.

- Scholarship closing dates vary but usually begin around the beginning of August
- Applications can take a lot of effort to prepare. There are applications forms to
 acquire and complete, often essays to write, certificates to be collected,
 photocopied and verified by a JP, passport photos to be taken and referee reports to
 be written. Most scholarships require an application enrolment for the institution to
 be submitted along with the scholarship application.
- Some scholarships require the school and/or scholarship provider to select the recipient.
- Every application requires the schools endorsement in the form of a reference from a Year 13 Dean or Teacher.
- Financial hardship applications require a declaration of parents' income. You may be eligible for a student allowance, refer www.studylink.govt.nz
- Because specific scholarships are competitive, the quality of the application is of the utmost importance. Emphasize what you can do for the scholarship, rather than what it can do for you. Ie. Mentoring, fundraising, and other community engagement within the university community.

Step by Step Guide to the Scholarship Process

STEP 1

Through your own research at your school Careers Room or from the Internet, decide on the course of study you wish to undertake and know why you want to study this course

STEP 2

Access the Moneyhub database https://www.moneyhub.co.nz/scholarship-nz.html

You can also access the **givMe** scholarship database at any public library, or at home using a library card. This site provided criteria for over 5000 scholarships.

STEP 3

Decide on the institution/s you wish to attend and the course you wish to enrol in. Visit the institution website/s to view specific information on scholarships offered by that institution in your faculty of interest.

STEP 4

Study the scholarship booklet provided and the **Moneyhub** database for more specific information.

Determine carefully if you meet the criteria for applying. Keep a copy of the scholarship regulations and due date so that you can discuss your short list with the Pathways Advisor in the Careers office.

STEP 5

When you finish completing a hard copy scholarship application, provide all completed documentation to the Careers Advisor for checking.

<u>UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS – Contestable with all schools</u>

These scholarships all appear in the Moneyhub listings but are the significant ones for each university, so we have highlighted them here for your convenience

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND TOP ACHIEVER SCHOLARSHIP (250 AWARDED)

Awarded to recognize and reward exceptional academic performance combined with outstanding sporting, artistic, cultural and / or leadership achievements. Up to the value of \$20,000 to include catered accommodation in a university hall of residence and two lump sum payments. To take up their offer of the Scholarship, applicants must achieve admission to The University of Auckland with a rank score of at least 270

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND POTENTIAL SCHOLARSHIPS (100 AWARDED)

Awarded on outstanding academic ability in Level 2 NCEA. Factors such as financial need, school decile, first in family, refugee background and disability will also be taken into consideration. Covers accommodation and/or study assistance.

Tier 1 – Up to value of \$20,000 over 3 years – requires a min NCEA rank score of 240

Tier 2 – Up to value of \$10,000 over 3 years – requires a min NCEA rank score of 220

Tier 3 – Up to value of \$6000 over 3 years – requires a min NCEA rank score of 200

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND MAORI ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP (25 Awarded)

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to recognise, and reward exceptional academic performance combined with outstanding sporting, artistic, cultural and / or leadership achievements among Māori students. The provision of University accommodation is designed to provide the best student experience and promote excellent academic outcomes. \$20,000 paid over three years, comprising a guaranteed funded place in University of Auckland catered accommodation in the first year and four lump sum payments in the second and third years

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND PACIFIC ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP (25 AWARDED)

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to recognise and reward exceptional academic performance combined with outstanding sporting, artistic, cultural and / or leadership achievements among Pacific students. The provision of University accommodation is designed to provide the best student experience and promote excellent academic outcomes. Selection \$20,000 paid over three years, comprising a guaranteed funded place in University of Auckland catered accommodation in the first year and four lump sum payments in the second and third years (see Regs. 2 & 3)

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND WAKA MOANA SCHOLARSHIP

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to financially support Māori students from low socioeconomic areas attending university for the first time having left secondary school or kura in the previous year. It covers one year accommodation and study related materials. Must have a rank score of 160

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND VAKA MOANA SCHOLARSHIP

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to financially support Māori students from low socioeconomic areas attending university for the first time having left secondary school or kura in the previous year. It covers one year accommodation and study related materials. Must have a rank score of 160

CLARK UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

To support students with academic merit and financial hardship enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts at the University of Auckland. Up to \$22,000 p.a. up to 4 years including accommodation in the first year at a university hall of residence.

AUCKLAND UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY

AUT offers 4 one-year scholarships in 4 categories

AUT ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Rank score of 300 points based on NCEA Level 2 results High academic achievement

AUT SIGNIFICANT STUDENT

Rank score of 250 points based on NCEA Level 2 High academic achievement Contribution at a high level to school or community, leadership positions and/or cultural or sport at a representative level \$6500 per year for duration of a 3-year degree.

NEW HORIZONS SCHOLARSHIP

(Decile 1 – 4 Auckland Region schools)

- Awarded to academically able students who can demonstrate leadership potential from Auckland Region Decile 1 – 4 schools
- Preference may be given to students enrolling at the AUT South Campus if the degree is offered at the South Campus

AUT SCHOOL LEAVER SCHOLARSHIP

3 Categories of scholarships

Successful applicants of each category will be awarded up to \$6500 to support full time study in a degree programme at AUT.

AUT KIWA UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP (MAORI AND PACIFIC STUDENTS)

- Awarded to academically able students demonstrating leadership potential who register with either Māori or Pacific ethnicity in the AUT student management system (Arion)
- Nationally contestable.

WOOLF FISHER FIRST IN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are for applicants who are the first in their family to seek to complete a degree. First-in-family normally means that neither of the applicant's birth parents has successfully completed a degree level qualification. You are still eligible if siblings are at university or have completed a degree. Must achieve university entrance and requirements of AUT programme. Involvement in leadership, sporting, cultural or community.

KIER TRUST STUDY AWARD

For students facing financial barriers to undertake tertiary study at AUT. Up to \$13,000 over 3 years of degree study and first year mentoring

MASSEY UNIVERSITY

MASSEY UNIVERSITY VICE CHANCELLOR'S EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Up to 9 scholarships will be awarded to the value of \$21,000 over three years of study for students with academic excellence, leadership and community engagement and contribution.

MASSEY UNIVERSITY HIGH ACHIEVER SCHOLARSHIP (ARTS AND ACADEMIC)

2 categories of scholarships

MASSEY UNIVERSITY HIGH ACHIEVER WITH DISTINCTION SCHOLARSHIP

up to 30 full and part time scholarships awarded annually to students with a previous record of high achievement in academics and arts (composition, performance, creative writing and/or visual arts) 10 scholarships for Maori students (arts and academics), 5 to Pasifika students (arts and academics), 5 to students studying arts, and 10 to students studying arts or academics. Excellence endorsement at Year 12 level. \$7500 over two years.

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students with minimum NCEA Level 2 with Excellence and demonstrated leadership ability through school, sporting, cultural and/or community settings. Accommodation fees up to \$14,000 for first year and \$10,000 toward tuition and accommodation for each of Year 2 and 3

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO "LEADERS OF TOMORROW" SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students with proven leadership capabilities with a minimum of NCEA Level 2 Merit and demonstrated leadership potential, sporting, cultural involvement and/or contribution to community. \$6000 for 1 year towards accommodation or living costs.

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO ALUMNI APPEAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students with a minimum of NCEA Level 2 with Merit and financial need with extra consideration for life circumstances that present significant barriers to study. \$6000 towards accommodation or tuition fees for the first year of study.

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO 150TH ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded based on academic excellence with minimum NCEA Level 2 endorsed with Merit. Demonstrated academic ability and significant financial need or life circumstances that present barriers to university study. Standard value of \$6000 for 1 year

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO DUX SCHOLARSHIP

The dux of every secondary school in NZ is eligible for this scholarship worth \$6000

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$16,000 for 3 years of degree for demonstrated excellence in performance and leadership ability in school, sporting, cultural and/or community settings. Minimum NCEA Level 2 with Merit

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO TU KAHIKA SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for young Maori students who aspire to study towards a careers in health. You will be provided with guaranteed accommodation in a University of Otago residential college, \$10000 towards residential college fees and extra support in your program. Successful applicants have a minimum of Level 2 in Chemistry, Physics or Biology, show a commitment to Maori health and Maori development, be motivated and determined to succeed.

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO PACIFIC PEOPLES' ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$10,000 FOR 1 year for Pacifica students enrolling in an undergraduate programme, based on a minimum achievement of a Merit endorsement in NCEA Level 2 with involvement in their Pacifica community and potential and motivation to succeed.

UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO MAORI ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$10,000 for 1 year for Maori students enrolling in an undergraduate programme, based on a minimum achievement of a Merit endorsement in NCEA Level 2 with involvement in their Maori community or knowledge of taha Maori and potential and motivation to succeed at University.

UNIVERSITY OF WAIKATO

UNIVERSITY OF WAIKATO TE PAEWAI o te RANGI SCHOLARSHIP

\$25,000 award over 3 years. Candidates must have achieved NCEA Level 2 with Excellence (or equivalent) and must show exceptional leadership qualities and/or be actively involved in community initiatives. Candidates may have taken a GAP year in 2020.

UNIVERSITY OF WAIKATO TE MANU KAEWA (SCHOOL LEAVERS) SCHOLARSHIP

Up to \$5000 for a student who demonstrates academic ability, leadership/community spirit, or serious financial need and/or extraordinary personal circumstances. Applied to accommodation costs or tuition fees at Hamilton or Tauranga campuses.

SIR EDMOND HILLARY SCHOLARSHIP

Up to \$10,000 per year scholarship for 3 years focused on significant academic achievement and excellence in sport, or creative and performing arts, and demonstrated leadership.

<u>UNIVERSITY OF WAIKATO INTERNATIONAL EXCELLENCE – NZ SCHOOL LEAVERS</u> SCHOLARSHIP 2021

Up to \$10,000 awarded to applicants who demonstrate excellent academic achievement and strong potential to become ambassadors for the University of Waikato. Must have achieved at least a Merit endorsement in NCEA Level 2.

TE ARA WHANUI SCHOLARSHIP

Up to \$10,000 awarded to applicants who demonstrate excellent academic achievement and have cultural excellence in Maori. Must have achieved at least a Merit endorsement in NCEA Level 2.

PACIFIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Up to \$10,000 awarded to applicants who demonstrate excellent academic achievement and connection to the Pacific community. Must have achieved at least a Merit endorsement in NCEA Level 2

VICTORIA UNIVERSITY OF WELLINGTON

VICTORIA UNIVERSITY WELLINGTON TANGIWAI SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to top school leaver applicants on the basis of academic excellence, leadership and commitment to the community. \$5000 towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence in first year, or towards living costs.

VICTORIA UNIVERSITY WELLINGTON TOTOWEKA SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to strong academic applicants who are Maori, Pasifika, from refugee backgrounds, disability or from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Based on achievement of Level 3 with at least 25 credits at Merit or Excellence. \$5000 towards accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence in first year, or towards living costs.

VICTORIA UNIVERSTIY WELLINGTON KAHOTEA SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to exceptional applicants, with appropriate academic results or achievement within areas of culture, community involvement, leadership or equity. Full accommodation costs at a Victoria hall of residence in first year, plus a \$5000 stipend for three years. Based on achievement of Level 3 with at least 25 credits at Merit or Excellence.

MASSEY BUSINESS SCHOOL FUTURE LEADERS SCHOLARSHIPS

\$10,000 award over 2 years. Must have achieved NCEA Level 2 Certificate with at least a Merit endorsement or better and be clearly capable of achieving University Entrance, have been the leader of a school academic or cultural group, or captain of one of the school's sport teams, or a leader within a community group or organization.

MĀ TE HURUHURU KA RERE TE MANU SCHOLARSHIP

2 Scholarships will be offered to young Māori talent, these are new scholarships and were created in partnership with our Manukura Māori Business Team.

This is for students who want to have a meaningful career where they can be themselves and make their own mark on the world.

Please note:

- Any number of students can apply (providing they are eligible) to the Scholarship Programme; there is no cap in terms of applicant numbers per school
- There is an opportunity for students with financial or personal hardship to highlight their circumstances as part of the online application. This is for students who without a Scholarship may struggle to attend University.

DEFENCE FORCES

NAVY/ARMY/AIR FORCE SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES

There are a range of scholarships available where, on successful completion of an Officer Selection Board, a Joint Office Induction Course and Junior Officer Common Training the defense forces will cover the cost of the duration of your degree at approved universities on a "year for year" Return of Service Obligation. This covers the following courses of study:

<u>NAVY TANGAROA SCHEME</u> – for Mechanical, Mechatronics, and Electrical and Electronics, Engineering and Engineering Technology degrees for the Engineering Officer trade/Political Studies, Business Management and Marine and Coastal Sciences programs for the Warfare Officer trade/Business & Management and Supply Chain Management degrees for the Supply Officer trade.

Also NAVY CHATHAM AND AMOKURA scholarships available

<u>ARMY SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME</u> – for a Medicine degree at University of Auckland or Otago for the Medical Officer Cadet Trade or Medical & Dental Officer Trade

<u>AIR FORCE SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME</u> – for a Bachelor of Informed Sciences, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Business Studies majoring in Computer Science, Information Systems, Information Technology, Computer System Engineering, Internet Systems or Software Engineering for the Technology, Computer System Engineering, Internet Systems or Software Engineering for the CIS Officer trade and a Bachelor of Engineering in Mechanical, Electrical, Electronics, Mechatronics,& Aeronautical Engineering for the Engineering Officer trade and a Bachelor of Commerce, Business Logistics or Supply Chain Management for the Supply Officer trade.

ENGINEERING

FULTON HOGAN ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Offered to students enrolling in Engineering at Auckland or Canterbury universities, includes and internship in summer breaks and possible employment at commencement of degree. 2^{nd} year -75% of fees

3rd year – 100% of fees

KEYSTONE TRUST STUDY AWARD

Financial assistance of \$5000 per annum for three years as well as mentoring and networking opportunities for New Zealand citizens with financial hardship or circumstantial need intending to study a property or construction related tertiary qualification at a tertiary institution, this includes any of the following degree level programs: Bachelor of Engineering, Architecture, Property, Land & Property Management, Business Studies (Property), Urban Planning, Construction, Building Science, Landscape Architecture, Spatial Design, Survey, Law & Property conjoint.

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND KICK START MERIT AWARD

Up to \$2000 based on academic merit of NCEA Level 2 and all round excellence in personal achievements towards Part 1 of the BE Hons at the University of Auckland

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND FACULTY OF ENGINEERING STUDENT SUPPORT AWARD

Up to \$2500 for domestic or international students entering in an undergraduate engineering degree, awarded based on academic achievement and financial hardship.

UNITEC MAORI & PASIFIKA TRADES TRAINING SCHOLARSHIPS

Full tuition fees if you are of Maori or Pacific descent with a desire to succeed in the trades industry and enrolling in any of the following New Zealand Certificate Level 3 courses: Plumbing, Gasfitting & Drainlaying, Automotive Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Construction Trades Skills – Carpentry pathway.

ENERGY EDUCATION TRUST UNDERGRADUATE & HONOURS SCHOLARSHIPS – AVAILABLE FROM 5 UNIVERSITIES

Up to \$5000 for course related expenses towards an undergraduate year in Science, Economics, Engineering or related fields based on academic achievement, and student interest in energy, future study, desire to succeed and community involvement.

CATHOLIC DIOCESE: THE ROBERT NED COVICH SCHOLARSHIP

For students who have contributed to the Catholic character of the College, and who intend to study Engineering at university. Family situation is considered.

\$2500 per year towards university studies. Two students may apply. Closes in September.

GENERAL

JUMP START SCHOLARSHIP

A \$5000 award provided by TPT, Lifewise and Auckland University of Technology (AUT) will partner to support a student, in the age range of 17-24 years old who has experienced homeless, at risk of becoming homeless or have a serious housing need to receive a university education.

Female New Zealand citizen or permanent resident enrolled in Unitec to be admitted full time into the New Zealand Diploma in Veterinary Nursing. Selection preference may be given to Maori, Pacific, first in family to pursue tertiary education or financial need. Award value \$7000

Highly subsidized fees for the New Zealand Certificate in Wellbeing – Health Assistant Level 3 (\$275 instead of \$3455), Advanced Support Level 4 (\$475 instead of \$3461), Dementia Care (\$250 instead of \$988)
